**General Information**

Stamford Downtown produces signature concert events that greatly contribute to the economic vitality of Stamford Downtown.

The Stamford Downtown Parade Spectacular is one of the largest helium balloon parades in the country with 15 balloons, 18 marching bands and many dance troupes. This single day event in Stamford CT attracts over 150,000 spectators. This annual event now in its 22<sup>h</sup> year is always held the Sunday before Thanksgiving this year's date is 11/18/18

To accomplish the latter, the District is requesting proposals of a full- service bleacher production company. The interested parties should be able to address the needs of the District in the most efficient manner possible.

**Program Objective** To produce Signature Events that contributes significantly to the economic vitality of the district.

**Scope of Work**

**Stamford Downtown Parade Spectacular—Sunday, November 18, 2018**

**1. Production Management:**

1. Attend all meetings as required by fire marshals and city officials.

**2. Production Services and equipment:**

1. Provide, install, and remove bleachers throughout the mile parade route in several locations to seat 1935 people.
2. Be available to install 4 days before the parade as well as the early morning of the parade.
3. Remove all bleachers within 2 days after the parade.
4. Have all necessary city permits for installation and inspection.

**3. Labor**

1. All labor required to install and remove the bleachers and its associated rigging should be included

**The proposal must contain the following items of information:**

1. Background and description of the firm
2. A description of the services and equipment that the firm will provide
3. Description of staffing plan
4. Description of the equipment that will be used.
5. A portfolio of large outdoor production and at least three references

**Insurance Requirements**

Evidence of a policy of general liability insurance insuring against any property damage in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence,

1. \$2,000,000 aggregate for general liability,
2. \$1,000,000 CLS automobile) and (hired and non-owned automobile coverage to be included)
3. \$500,000/500,000/500,000 Employers liability (workers' compensation), \$10,000,000 umbrella. The owner of the venue, the City of Stamford and the DSSD its agents, employees and representatives should be listed as additional insured for general liability with a waiver of subrogation for general liability and workers' compensation and contain a provision stating that the District will be notified not less than 30 days in advance of the cancellation of any such policy.
