## SALLY'S APIZZA OPENS IN STAMFORD DOWNTOWN

Sally's Apizza enjoyed a long anticipated opening on Thursday, October 7th at 66 Summer Street (adjacent to the Majestic Bow Tie Cinema). The new upscale Stamford Downtown location marks the first new location outside of New Haven since the restaurants founding in 1938 by Salvatore "Sally" Consiglio and his wife Flora "Flo". With 4,000 square feet of modern architecture seating 180 people, the restaurant features signature honey oak paneling with memorabilia celebrating Sally's history as a favorite spot for legends such as Frank Sinatra and The Rolling Stones. The unique 2-story mezzanine with floor to ceiling windows creates a warm inviting atmosphere. Al fresco dining, seamless pickup, take-out and delivery provide flexible guest choices. The coal-fired pizza remains the focal point as Sally's promises to remain true to its roots. 
