

CTTRANSIT AND CTFASTRAK 31-DAY BUS PASSES AVAILABLE FOR PURCHASE ON SMARTPHONES

The Connecticut Department of Transportation (CTDOT) announced that CT*transit* and CT*fastrak* customers can now purchase their 31-day pass on their smartphones through <u>Token Transit</u>.

"The ability to purchase bus fares through Token Transit improves the customer experience by giving our customers more freedom in paying for their fares and improving boarding times at stops," said Connecticut Department of Transportation Bureau Chief of Public Transportation Benjamin Limmer.

To use Token Transit, customers can download the Token Transit mobile app or use Transit App, Moovit, Agile Mile, or Google Maps, which are all integrated with Token Transit. Here's how it works:

> • As buses approach, customers who purchased passes via Token Transit will be able to open their app and tap on the pass to activate it.

> • The applicable period (two hours or 31 days) for which the ticket is available begins once the pass is activated.

 \cdot Once on the bus, customers should follow the instructions in

the app to validate the ticket and show the bus operator.


All CT*fastrak* and CT*transit* local buses will accept Token Transit, including the Hartford, New Haven, and Stamford Divisions, as well as CT*transit* in Bristol, Meriden, New Britain, Wallingford, and Waterbury. *Please note CTtransit Express buses are not currently included as part of this program.* For more information, visit <u>Token Transit</u> or <u>CTtransit.com</u>.

STAMFORD DOWNTOWN MOVES TO ELECTRIFY ENVIRONMENTAL MAINTENANCE EQUIPMENT

Stamford Downtown continues to foster efforts to mitigate climate change and reduce carbon emissions. Stamford Downtown is working with its vendor, Block-By-Block, to convert the Ambassador Team's gas-powered Environmental Maintenance equipment to more environmentally conscious rechargeable battery power. The new battery-powered equipment includes multiple leaf blowers, and a hedge trimmer.

In the future, Stamford Downtown and Block-By-Block hope to convert the balance of equipment inventory – including its weedwackers, chain saw, light-duty snow blower, and handheld scrubber for graffiti removal – to battery power. In addition to reducing carbon emissions, Stamford Downtown's investment in battery-powered equipment will reduce noise pollution and gaseous odors. Stamford Downtown's use of electric equipment, as well as its urban forestry efforts and advocacy for a pedestrian-friendly setting, position the organization as a leader in promoting environmentally sustainable practices.
