

STAMFORD DOWNTOWN WELCOMES BACK THE SOUNDS OF GIULIANO'S SCHOOL OF MUSIC





Stamford Downtown proudly welcomes back Giuliano's School of Music, now located at 441 Summer Street. Established in 1975 by Giuliano Balestra as a White Plains vintage guitar shop and expanded to Stamford in 1996 under his son and current owner, Bobby Balestra, the school has served lower Fairfield County for over 40 years. Giuliano's offers comprehensive music education, quality instrument rentals, and renowned guitar repair services.

For those interested in learning piano, oboe, cello, French horn, tenor saxophone, or other instruments, Giuliano's provides both private and group lessons for all ages and skill levels. Their flexible, year-round programs cater to everyone from students in school music programs to adults picking up an instrument for the first time. Currently, they are offering open enrollment for their popular "Summer of Rock" Camp 2025, a two-week musical expression program for children aged 7-14 interested in guitar, voice, bass, keyboard, drums, or woodwinds. Participants will compose original songs and perform as bands at the end of the session.

Giuliano's also offers affordable instrument rentals for back-to-school needs, and adults can explore a wide selection of instruments and accessories in their on-site music store. The school's legendary guitar repair services, honed by Bobby Balestra's apprenticeship with Carlo Greco, have attracted a prestigious clientele of international artists, including Eric Clapton, BB King, and Peter Frampton, solidifying their reputation in the music world.


