Stamford Downtown's vibrant nightlife just got even better with the opening of New York Comedy Club Stamford, featuring authentic New York stand-up comedians at 230 Tresser Boulevard. Situated on the Stamford Town Center Plaza, alongside The Capital Grille, Terra Gaucha, Pieology Pizzeria, Peter Chang, and the soon-to-open Puerto Vallarta, the club has a cozy nostalgic vibe reminiscent of the New York City comedy scene. Partners Emilio Savone, Scott Lindner, and Jim Panels saw the potential for the first New York Comedy Club suburban location outside of Manhattan in the former Plan B Burger space six months ago and were pleased to open on February 11th to TWO sold-out audiences. ALEX NELSON GROWS IN HIS ROLE AS TEAM LEAD

In 2022, Alex Nelson, a longtime member of Stamford Downtown's Environmental Maintenance Team, was promoted to the position of Team Leader. In that role, Alex assists the Operations Manager with oversight of all members of Stamford Downtown's Environmental Maintenance Team while helping to create team schedules and ensuring statistics reflecting team outcomes are properly recorded in Block-By-Block's online portal. Alex closely monitors team members to ensure daily curbside cleaning and special projects – such as painting, power washing, and removal of gum remnants – are executed properly and at the highest quality.

Alex recently led the Environmental Maintenance Team's response to the first measurable snow event of this winter season. During that storm, Alex and his team focused on clearing curb cuts along sidewalks that experience the highest level of pedestrian traffic while also clearing bus shelters and removing snow from around parking meters. This effort is crucial to ensuring downtown can return to business and full activity as soon as possible following the completion of a winter weather event.

WASHINGTON BOULEVARD ROADWAY SAFETY STUDY

The Washington Boulevard Roadway Safety Study is a joint effort between the City of Stamford and the Connecticut Department of Transportation to comprehensively analyze roadway safety on Washington Blvd.

This study is focusing on the area of Washington Boulevard between Hoyt Street and Station Place. As part of the study, the team will analyze various data points such as crash history, roadway geometry, vehicle volumes and speed, pedestrian and bicycle usage, ADA compliance, and several other factors. A crucial component of this study is also the public's comments and feedback about how they use the corridor every day. Your feedback is paramount as we look to enhance safety on this roadway.

The City of Stamford has committed to eliminating roadway deaths and serious injuries by 2032, and this project is one component of the City's <u>Vision Zero</u> efforts. Washington Boulevard has had the highest rate of fatalities on any road in Stamford in the last three years, and this study seeks to address this issue and create a safer roadway for all.

The purpose of this survey is one part of the Study Team's outreach strategy to gain feedback about how the public uses the road every day. Your personal experience and insight are invaluable and the City thanks you for your participation in this process to create a safer Washington Boulevard.

STAMFORD SMALL BUSINESS COVID-19 RELIEF GRANT

The City of Stamford established the Stamford Small Business COVID-19 Relief Grant to provide limited, one-time direct financial assistance of up to \$10,000 to eligible Stamford for-profit small businesses that have been adversely impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

The City of Stamford will reserve one-third of the total grants for small business enterprises that are owned and operated by minorities, women, people with disabilities, and veterans. Businesses that qualify for these reserved grants will need to submit a <u>self-certification form</u> as part of their application.

The City of Stamford will make the application for this grant available on its website on Monday, April 3, 2023.

The deadline to submit the application will be Friday, April 28, 2023.
